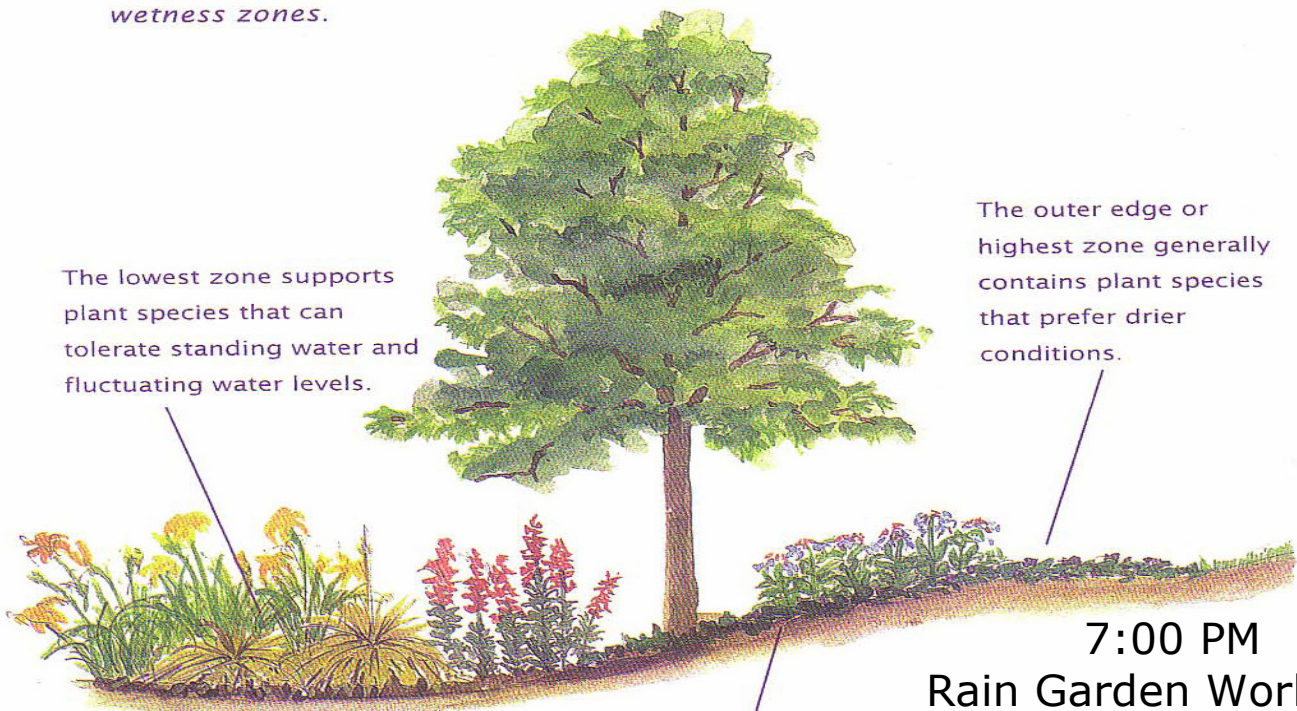


# Learn How to Create Your Own Rain Garden

## Tuesday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>

A rain garden is a shallow landscaped depression that uses native plants to the region, which require little or no watering thus helping to save our precious water and beautify the landscape, capture and filter storm water runoff, and help purify and recharge ground water.

*Your Rain Garden is composed of woody plants (trees and shrubs) and herbaceous species (flowers, grasses, and ground covers) planted in three wetness zones.*
